Washington, D.C. — This is the traditional weekend around Thanksgiving when we think about things of life which we enjoy.

paign which ended on November 6 when the voters of Idaho extended their State Constitution's naturalization guarantee to the same rights to vote, serve on juries, and hold civil office as are enjoyed by native citizens of Idaho, and native-born citizens in Utah.

Trade unions join White House push to eliminate discrimination in jobs

WASHINGTON — The AFL-CIO's 119 individual unions signed a resolution last Friday calling for an end to job discrimination in all activities.

President Kennedy commanded and, said the unions' joint statement, "will not be denied equal opportunities in every field." He urged labor as well as government to "discriminate what is just."

President Lyndon B. Johnson, who also signed the agreement as chairman of the President's Committee on Equal Employment Opportunity, said the

commitments will mean "greater equality and greater strength" for the unions.

AFL-CIO president George Meany said the AFL-CIO is making a sincere effort to eliminate job discrimination.

Specific Actions

Participating in the ceremony, in addition to Vice President and the presidents of the nation's ranking officials of the union, were President Kennedy, Secretary of Labor Robert F. Kennedy, and Chairman of the President's Committee, Executive Vice Chairman Chairman Robert W. Schmitz, George Meany and AFL-CIO Secretary-Treasurer William F. Schmitz.

President Kennedy cited the long history of labor's fight against discrimination and pointed out that "it is time for us to invite you to participate in something new but to join together with us in attacking discrimination in more areas, across the entire spectrum of the national government, the promises of the labor movement, the principles of our Constitution, the promises of the whole concept of our country."

He called upon the unions to "use every means available to all in the field of hiring, training, transfer and promotion."

President's Comm. on Equal Employment Opportunity reviews 19-month operation

WASHINGTON, D.C.—In its 19-month operation, the President's Committee on Equal Employment Opportunity has taken corrective action in 90 per cent of the complaints of discrimination filed with the agency, and 37 per cent in complaints involving government contractors.

That was reported this week by Robert Taylor, Jr., executive vice-chairman of the President's Committee on Equal Employment Opportunity in Washington.

Taylor reported that the committee had received 1,236 complaints in its first year, and 1,000 in its second year, and started by George
