Providing the Senate passes a civil rights bill with open housing requirements or other provisions not in the original House bill, there are two actions the House could take: (1) the House could take up the civil rights bill immediately on arrival from the Senate on a motion to concur in the Senate amendments. If the motion is adopted, the bill would go to the White House for the President's approval. (2) It could, in the event its members approve amendments either to strengthen, modify or knock out any housing provision, adopt a motion to send the conflicting versions to conference for reconciliation of differences.

reconciliation of differences. If past experience is any indication of what will happen in the future, in 1966, the House barely passed a milder open ousing provision than the pending measure, in a test vote by 180 to 179.

by 180 to 179. What appears to be certain, at the moment, is that the pending civil rights bill with open housing will undergo con-siderable difficulty in the House; where the decision of whether or not this nation will have any civil rights legislation this year will be made.
