PC LEGISLATIVE CALENDAR

Already circulated to the JACL chapter presidents by Barry Matsumoto, our Washington Representative, is a memorandum outlining a number of congressional bills of particular interest to Japanese Americans. Sufficient information has been provided to ascertain

the intent.

The PC has long been interested in publishing such a listing (see below) on a permanent basis—not only of bills at the federal level but of bills at the offsy of other at the federal revel but of bits at the state level where JACL chapters exist. Frank Iwama of Sacramento is drafting a list of bills pending at the California legislature, which will be added to this compilation. And we solicit other readers in other

Continuing with Barry's memorandum, persons wishing to inquire or express an opinion on any of the bills should include the specific number of the bill when writing the Senator or Congressman.

ZIP code for members of the House of Representatives is Washington, D.C. 20515; for members of the U.S. Senate, it's Washington, D.C. 20510.

As of May, this 93rd Session, about 9,000 bills have already been introduced in the House alone and about 2,000 bills in the Senate.

To scan such a mass of bills is an arduous task and without a full-time Washington JACL representative on hand to prepare the synopsis as Barry has done, this legislative calendar could have been less meaningful or motivating. Furthermore, the basic data and status of bills are now retrievable from a computer, so advises our PC district representative Kaz Oshiki, administrative assistant to Rep. Kastenmeier of Wisconsin. The key is to call up data through use of the number of the bill.

Issei were not even permitted to become citizens nor were they allowed to obtain ownership in real property; American-born Nisei, without even the minimum rights of due process guaranteed by our Constitution, were herded like mere animals into government concentration camps; many third generation Sansei were born and raised in government concentration camps behind barbed wire and isolated from the general community.

Now that the great record of the Japanese American soldiers is generally known to everyone, many knowledgeable commentators and historians have pondered and asked the question—why? Why would so many Japanese Americans be willing to make the ultimate sacrifice for a nation that denied them any of the basic freedoms for which they died? What then night have motivated the Japanese American soldiers to so gallantly serve a nation that appeared to betray them?

The Sentinel was largely the creation of Vaughn Mechau, the WRA reports officer. He gathered a staff of evacuees to write and edit the news and features, found a way to finance it through the evacuee co-op, and arranged to have it printed in the shop of the Cody Enterprise, a weekly newspaper. For a staff nucleus he had a number of professionals including Haruo Imura, a veteran of Bay Area Nisei journalism, and Louise Suski and Martha Kaihatsu of the Ratu Shimpo English section. The Enterprise had to have additional help to handle the Sentinel and soon it hired Leroy Takaichi, a printer from San Jose, and John Yamamoto, a Linotype operator from Los Angeles.

Their product was lively weekly newspaper that, in addition to publishing the news, played no little part in upholding evacuee morale. For example, when Wyoming's Senator E. V. Robertson was making some wild charges in Washington about how the evacuees were being pampered. The Sentinel suggested he didn't know what he was talking about and invited him by telegram to visit the camp and get a first-hand look at conditions. The invitation was publicized in The Sentinel, and the story was picked up by the news services and published in other newspapers. Senator Robertson didn't bother to reply, and never found time to visit the camp, but the number of his pronouncements fell off substantially.

But even more interesting will be the stories of what's happened to each of the staffers since The Sentinel published its last issue 28 years ago.
