The Asian Law Caucus, Inc., of Oakland has re-fused a National JACL offer of \$2,500 to support its legal assistance program and its June 14 position paper explains why. While it may appear JACL is sav-ing that amount, it is not an enriching stance when

ing that amount, it is not an enriching stance when you consider all that was involved.

Originally, the Asian Law Caucus proposed a \$30,000 project. It was presented by the Bay Area Community JACL and approved by the Northern California-Western Nevada JACL District Council at its pre-convention meeting in May, 1972. However, this proposal was submitted as part of a \$60,000 legal committee package submitted by then National JACL legal counsel Bob Takasugi. No action was taken during the important budget session of the 1972 National Convention for lack of an advocate on the floor. Convention for lack of an advocate on the floor.

The original \$30,000 proposal was then introduced during the final session when convention resolutions were being discussed—the strategy then being for a JACL-funded legal aid unit to draw support from the Endowment Fund, general funds or other sources. By this time, of course, the 1973-74 budget had been adopted at \$359,687 with a \$31,937 deficit—that is, general membership dues were not increased sufficiently to meet the budget minus the estimated \$25,000 interest from the Endowment Fund.

Pushing a resolution with a price figure after the budget has been adopted is a futile show where general JACL funds are concerned and advocates now on the scene were aware of that.

EX-JACL legal counsel Bill Marutani of Philadelphia, commentinf on the resolution said. "It is high time for JACL to provide legal service..., and start using the Endowment Fund to meet the needs of our people rather than having it sit idle". He further suggested that if there were any reservations about the figure, the amount could be amended to read "up to \$30.000".

SANSEI PSYCHOLOGY—Excuse me, I was listen-ing to some Sansel talking the other day and what I heard provoked more than a little interest and concern. The occasion was Denver's Japanese American community dinner for high school and college graduates sponsored jointly by virtually all the organizations in towns. It probably is the major community-wide function, made possible by a lot of selfless hard work and the kind of cooperation that has largely gape out of style.

The gist of the conversation was that these Sansei, who in most cases were exceptionally good students, were looking forward to college with considerable anxiety. They seemed to be painfully aware of their racial minority status. They wondered how they would be treated by their fellow students. They were worried about whether they would be accepted. Some anticipated racial slights and slurs. What it boiled down to, as I understand the situation, was that these Sansei were terribly and frighteningly up-tight about Sansei were terribly and frighteningly up-tight about

One of those in the group was a college student who had been accepted for advanced studies. He, too, admitted that he had been filled with anxieties when he left high school, and he reported with wonder in his voice that he had been well-accepted in college. It was as though he had half-expected to be kicked in the teeth and called a dirty Jap, and he was surprised when no one had done it.

Later, thinking about what had been voiced, I wondered to myself whether these youngsters were "typical," whether other Sansei in other parts of the country are experiencing similar anxieties. I hope not. Because if they are, they are concerning themselves largely with ghosts that don't exist, at least not from this viewpoint.

Let me speak like an old codger, which I have

Let me speak like an old codger, which I have come to be. It was exactly 40 years ago this year that I was graduated from high school. There was a goodly number of other Nisei in Seattle, my home town, who got their high school diplomas that year. I don't pretend to speak for all of them, but the ones I knew were optimistic, perhaps even cocky, about their personal prospects as they surveyed a sorry, depression-burdened world. A good many of that bunch went on to college, some of us because there were no jobs and it was easier just continuing with our educations.

We knew as surely as the sun would rise that we would face discrimination when it came to job-hunting time. The doors of opportunity would be slammed in our faces. But we also knew that there was equality of opportunity to learn in the classrooms, and we applied ourselves without anxiety or fear. Perhaps we were what the Japanese would call "baka-shojiki"—naive, unsophisticated, foolish. Perhaps we were kidding ourselves. But we said to hell with it and went forward unairaid.

On May 7, 1972, a protection of laws to guarantee equality of opportunity have been implemented, and a wide cross-section of the American public has been sensitized to the need for overcoming racial discrimination. Under the circumstances it is difficult to understand the apprehension expressed by the young people I overheard.

One doesn't always gain courage by listening to a pep talk, but I hope it will encourage the shy, troubled, anxious members of the Sansei generation when I say the difficult road has been trod by their elders. Many were bruised and scarred, but most of them came through in good shape. And they helped make the road infinitely less painful for the Sansei.
