



PALE INK—If you've wondered, as I have, about the first Asians to come to the New World, you will be interested in a book titled "Pale Ink", by Henriette Mertz, published recently by the Swallow Press of Chicago. Miss Mertz's contention is that a Buddhist priest named Hwui Shan visited North and Central America in the 5th Century A.D., and at least one other Chinese expedition explored a substantial part of western North America about 2200 B.C.—more than 4,000 years ago.

Miss Mertz's contentions are based on ancient Chinese records. She reports that Hwui Shan's story, contained in a report of his trip to a far country to the east called Fu-sang, was examined at length by various scholars in the last century and in large part discounted. The earlier story is from 18 books, all that remain of a monumental work called "Classic of Mountain and Seas," which Miss Mertz describes as an astonishingly detailed geography. Unfortunately, only a few of these volumes have been translated and there is much evidence that the account was edited and condensed many times over the centuries so that the full story is unavailable. The title of her book, incidentally, is derived from a saying attributed to Confucius—"Pale ink is better than the most retentive memory."

And pale indeed is the ink that tells of these Chinese explorations. Nonetheless, Miss Mertz has gone to great pains to draw deductions, many believable but much implausible, which she feels prove her point. If anything, her book underscores the scarcity of scholarly works relating to the earliest contacts between Asia and the Americas between Asia and the Americas.

Miss Mertz says that the history of both China and Japan relate stories of "boatloads of thousands of people" sailing out across the Pacific in search of a fabled promised land. She also makes reference to a Smithsonian Institution publication regarding pottery discovered in Ecuador, dated about 500 B C, decorated in almost identical manner to the Jones pottery of in almost identical manner to the Jomon pottery of Japan made in the same period. Perhaps even more Japan made in the same period, remaps even more impressive are photographs in "Pale Ink" which dramatize similarities in Cambodian and Mexican temple architecture from the same period, and the resemblence in figurines and carvings from both sides

Miss Mertz draws certain deductions which suggest that Quetzalcoatl, the legendary fair-skinned, bearded god of Mexican folklore, was indeed Hwui Shan. Aztec legends told of the coming of Quetzalcoatl some 800 years before the Spaniards arrived, and this would make it somewhere in the neighborhood of 500 A.D. Quetzalcoatl is said to have brought to the Mexican people knowledge of irrigation and agriculture, a calendar system, measurement of time by astronomical calculation, metallurgy, mining and polishing of precious stones, and idolary—all known to Chinese civilization of that time. lization of that time.

Equally interesting is the way Miss Mertz traces the explorations of Hwui Shan from Point Hueneme, north of Los Angeles, to the Kingdom of Women near what is now the Mogollon Mesa, then northeastward to the Black Gorge (the Black Canyon of the Gunnison) not far from snow-capped peaks (the Rockies). She also suggests that the Sea of Varnish mentioned by Hwui Shan is the La Brea tar pits, that lakes the color of milk are soda or borax swamps, and Hwui Shan's to trees like bamboo which bears fruit that keeps the year-round is corn.

Scholars are likely to scoff at Pale Ink, and in fact many of the deductions seem far-fetched. But all in all, it makes for interesting reading and stirs a desire to learn more about the visitors from the Far East, if any, who wandered about these parts long before Columbus or even Lief Ericson discovered the New


