A SENSE OF IDENTITY—A recent issue of the Wall Street Journal explores the new interest in their cultural heritage among Americans of Armenian descent. Seeking the reason for this interest, the Wall Street Journal article says: "The growth of ethnic awareness and pride that has deeply affected Blacks and other groups in recent years is now helping to rescue even the smallest nationalities from oblivion. (The word "nationalities" is misused here. The anationality of Armenian Americans is American, but this kind of error is so common we'll just let it go.)

"A generation ago many assumed that the Armenians, Ukrainians, Rumanians and numerous other small nationalities in America would simply melt into American society and disappear forever as distinct subcultures. But today, these groups are striving as never before to assert their identities and perpetuate their cultures. And they are making headway."

Although the article concentrates almost entirely on the Armenians and does not mention the Japanese Americans, there are some interesting parallels and differences between the two groups.

For example, a middle-aged Armenian American is quoted as saying. "When I was a boy, my parents used to despair that we would be dead as a community in 20 years—but that's all changed now."

Many if not most Nisei would say they "expected," not "despaired," that the old country culture would disappear in a couple of decades. In fact, at the time the bulk of the Nisei were going to grade school the thrust was on "Americanization" which meant rejection of old country culture and values. Many teachers made it appear that one was unpatriotic to indicate any interest or pride or curiosity about the ancestral ways. Apparently the Armenian Americans went through the same experience. One says:

"When I was a girl, I tried to be as American as possible. My cousins and I would even go into another car on the subway just so we wouldn't be embarrassed by our parents speaking Armenian." And another says:

"Now the Armenians ha

There is, of course, one major difference. Armenian Americans can quickly become part of the great American majority. The Japanese Americans are of the minority, the way we've insisted on dividing the nation with White on one side and non-Whites on the other, and will remain as part of the minority so long as we make race an important consideration.

But while we abhor racism, race is what holds many of the minorities together. Still the Wall Street Journal discovered that the Armenian Americans are drifting away from the old culture despite the new pride in ethnic origins. "As first generation immigrants die, use of many 'old country' languages suffers, not matter what schools and churches do," the reporter writes. "Languages may not be crucial to ethnic identity, but they help, ethnic leaders say Reflecting fears prevalent in other groups, the Very Rev. John Danylevich, rector of New York's Ukranian Orthodox Church of St. Volodimir asks: "What does the Ukraine really mean for the small child born in America?"

A good question. What will Japan and Japanese culture mean for the Yonsel child being brought up by sanser parents who themserves had almost no contact with their own Issel immigrant grandparents? What it boils down to is that while certain persons may encourage others to study and perpetuate the ancestral culture, each individual will follow his own particular interests and there really isn't much practical point in trying to do otherwise.


