NATIONAL COUNCIL NARRATIVE

4th day highlights: Resolutions, Constitution

The narrative for the fourth day—Friday, June 25—of the 24th Biennial National JACL Convention refers to the late resolutions, funding the Resolutions campaign, constitutional amendments and the credentials problem...

In 1972, the changeover occurred. JACL earned \$18,250 at the end of 1972 when the fund had a paper value of \$350,000.

Resolutions

R-19 (Sequoia JACL) renaming Headquarters to "Mas Satow Bldg" was unanimously carried. Chuck Kubokawa introduced the resolution...

The San Francisco motion recognized the local nature of any redevelopment issue and the National Board authorizing action at the local level was cited as "executive ability" by the resolutions chairman...

Biennium Afterthoughts

Endowment Fund

Shig Sugiyama (pres) first called for a brief report of the Endowment Fund committee from its chairman, Yone Satoeda (San Francisco), who was unable to present it at the appointed time on the agenda.

R-23 (Bay Area Community JACL) to technically implement the 1974 resolution to "step the threat" of destruction by redevelopment of any Nihonmachi and uphold the rights of residents and small businesses to remain therein was withdrawn.
